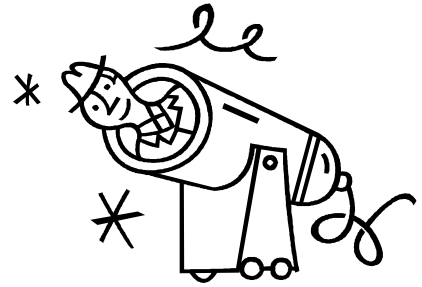
A **NOUN** IS A PERSON, PLACE OR THING LIKE JOHN, STRATFORD ROAD SCHOOL OR CAR.
